

Nehemiah Charity, Cobani. Victor and Lilia Zama began the Nehemiah Charity in 2015. Their mission statement is "to improve the quality of life for different age

groups through social, spiritual, educational and entrepreneurial activities". These activities are based in the Wings of Hope Community Centre and include: cooking and delivering hot meals to the elderly; after school clubs for children; youth groups; summer camps; parent and toddler groups; a club for older people including trips to historic places; a social laundry; distributing food parcels; and providing coal and wood for the winter to those most vulnerable. They serve over 500 beneficiaries in five villages.

The Charity Mission for people with Disabilities in

Straseni was founded in 2002 by Petru and Antonina Chirica, based in the town of Straseni near the capital city of Chisinau. Their daughter, Doina, joined them as the project manager in 2016. They have various projects centred around inclusion for children and adults with disabilities, including a running day centre for children, residential summer camps and delivering inclusion training to churches and secular organisations.



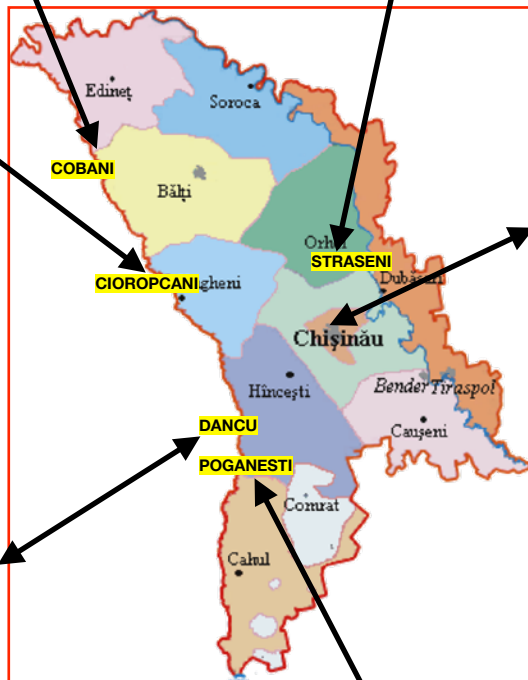
Pastor Vasile and Natasha help to lead a church in

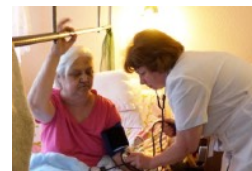


founded the Tabita Agricultural Association in 2002, to help poor farmers to become self sufficient. This has developed to include various businesses and social ministries. The vision is that the businesses become sustainable, enabling them to fund their own social projects and become independent. This was the dream of senior pastor Dumitru Cravcencu (right in photo). He works closely with his son-in-law, Pastor Slavic Duman (left), who oversees all these projects.



Emanuel Clinic, Chisinau,

has a vision to provide the poor and needy with reliable and corruption free medical treatment. They provide over 18,000 consultations a year. UK Charity, Medical Missionary News, and Breadline work together to help them to deliver Mobile Clinics in remote rural areas where people do not have easy access to medical services. They provide free consultations and medication to over 1000 people every year.



Poganesti is a village five miles from Dancu. Pastor Victor and his wife, Nina, have been serving here since 2000. The main outreach ministry is youth work, headed up by their daughter, Vica and her husband Slavic. They run a youth club at weekends

attended by 12 young people. In addition they organise summer camps and special events at Christmas and Easter when they can have up to 100 children and young people. They also deliver food parcels to the most vulnerable families in the village, and distribute humanitarian aid received from Dancu Church
